

Saint of the Week

April 30 | Blessed Pauline von Mallinckrodt

auline von Mallinckrodt was born in Minden, Westphalia on June 3, 1817. Her father, a Lutheran who held a government position, allowed her to be raised by her mother as a Catholic, to his own political detriment. Pauline was the eldest of four children, and she assumed care of them and the household when her mother died. At the age of 17 Pauline became the lady of the house and managed the tasks of entertaining her father's friends and caring for her younger siblings. Though she felt called by God to religious life, she could not follow her dream until the age of 32.

From a young age, Pauline was instructed by her mother to treat all people with dignity and compassion. She accompanied her mother on her charitable visits to the sick poor and learned many practical skills which served her later in life. When her father died, Pauline devoted herself to starting a kindergarten, which later on led to opening an Institute for the Blind. When the Bishop suggested she should found her own religious community, Pauline prayed and discerned. She and three other companions started the Sisters of Christian Charity on August 21, 1849 in Paderborn, Germany. Though their first ministry was with the blind, soon the needs of the time led to ministries in schools, orphanages and hospitals.

During the persecution of Catholics in Germany in the 1870's, the Sisters were forced to leave the institutions where they were teaching and ministering. Providentially, at the same time Bishops in the U.S. were asking for Sisters to work with German immigrants. Mother Pauline sent the first Sisters to North and South America in 1873. Requests quickly followed from many dioceses, and by the time of Mother Pauline's death in 1881, the Sisters had opened 46 new institutions in North America alone. Today they can be found in seven countries.

Pauline von Mallinckrodt was beatified in 1985 by Pope John Paul II.

Blessed Pauline, pray that the image of Jesus be formed in us.
