2nd Sunday of Advent

Prepare the way of the Lord in our hearts and in the hearts of those around us.



'n today's Gospel, we hear that a prophecy from Isaiah is being fulfilled by John the Baptist. John is the one of whom it is written, Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John the Baptist fulfilled this prophecy two thousand years ago by preaching that Jesus was the Messiah, and pointing toward him in all of his words and actions. But preparing the way for the Lord was not just a task for John the Baptist — it's a task for each one of us. Now it's our turn to prepare the way of the Lord in our own hearts as well as in the world around us.

One of the most important things we can do this Advent season is to prepare our own heart to receive Jesus. The big question is: how do I do this? First and foremost, we must spend some time with Jesus in prayer. We can treat our prayer time like an appointment, setting aside some time each day to spend with God, even if it's only five or ten minutes. We can refrain from giving God the "leftovers" of our day, instead offering the first fruits of time when we're awake and alert. We might prepare the way of the Lord in our hearts by spending time reading Scripture, praying a rosary or praying in adoration in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Whatever we do, it will help us prepare our hearts to receive Jesus.

But our focus can't be only on self during this season of Advent. Just like John the Baptist, we want to prepare the way of the Lord in such a way that those around us might more easily be brought into an encounter with Jesus. John the Baptist, through his words and actions, was able to bring people into an encounter with the Lord; our words and actions can have the same effect if we're intentional about them.

During this Advent season, we can take some time to talk to family, friends, co-workers, or classmates about the true meaning of Christmas. It may be a small action or a simple word from us that opens up the way of the Lord in that person's heart. Just like John, we should point to Jesus in all that we do and say. Be a witness for Christ. After all, we have all been called by name to a life of discipleship.

Saint of the Week

December 12 | Our Lady of Guadalupe



ary, under the title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, is one of the most endearing stories in Church history. She continues to be held in reverence and is honored by millions of people who journey to the Mexican basilica each year.

In 1531 Juan Diego, an Indian peasant who lived near Mexico City, was walking to Mass early one morning. He heard someone call his name and went to investigate. He saw a lovely lady dressed in shining garments and she asked him to visit the bishop and request that a church be built on that spot in her honor. Juan did as he was asked and though the bishop received him kindly, his story was not believed.

Mary visited him again, even though Juan tried to avoid her. She told him to go to the top of the hill and gather flowers there as proof for the bishop. He did so, amazed that flowers were growing in the middle of winter. As he opened his cloak in the presence of the bishop, the Castilian roses dropped to the floor and both of them saw the miraculous image of Mary on the inside of Juan's cloak – the image we know as Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Church was built and the image was enshrined there, where it remains to this day, in the new basilica. Within six years of the apparition, six million Aztec Indians were converted to the Catholic faith.

Mary, the Queen and Mother of the Mexican people, is pictured as a pregnant woman in native dress, as she appeared to Juan. The image has been scientifically tested over the years but remains inexplicable in its substance and origin. It has withstood floods, smoke damage, and even a bomb that exploded in the Church. The cloak remained unharmed, and the method used to create the image is still unknown.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, bless our Mexican brothers and sisters. Intercede for all of us that we may grow in love and peace.
