Welcome Fr. Marcin Kania



It is with great joy that we welcome Father Marcin Kania to The Church of Christ the King. Father Marcin officially began his assignment here on June 29, 2018, the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, and has been in America for five years.

Father Marcin grew up in Debica, Poland. His parents, Jan Kania and Krystyna Kania (both deceased) raised him and his sister and four brothers in a Catholic family with strong faith and traditions. Tragically, his 45-year-old brother, Pawel, died this past spring in a car accident. He has several nieces and nephews.

Father Marcin attended Holy Apostles College and Seminary, Cromwell, Connecticut. He was ordained as a Transitional Deacon on May 14, 2016, ordained as a priest, by Bishop Serratelli, on July 2, 2017, and appointed Parochial Vicar at Assumption, Morristown.

Father Marcin will be with us in a full-time capacity but will also be taking a few supplemental theology courses at Seton Hall. I invite you to welcome Father Marcin into our family of faith. If you love him half as much as you love me, he will be well loved.

As I celebrate my third anniversary as your Pastor, I am excited for what lies ahead for Father Marcin. It has been a great blessing, for me, to be a part of this warm-welcoming, faithful-friendly, generous, great family of faith. I told Father Marcin that his first order of business was to make friends with the geese; so far so good.

Please note that the diocese asks that all children have two years of Religious Education prior to the reception of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist.




Faith Direct

Saint of the Week

July 18 | *St. Camillus*



Camillus was born on May 25, 1550 in Buccianico, Italy. Early in his life he struggled with his gambling addiction, as well as his hot temper, inherited from his father. His mother was nearly 50 when she gave birth to him, and was unable to control him as he grew up. She died when Camillus was 12. His father was an Army officer and seldom home. Other family members took him in and he was largely neglected by them.

At age 16, Camillus joined the army with his father and fought in a war against the Turks. He was wounded in the leg and suffered for years when it would not heal. He gambled away all his possessions and took a gardening job at a Franciscan Friary. One of the friars who saw a better side in him tried to work with him to tame his fiery nature and gambling habit. He was converted in 1575 and sought to enter the order. However, due to his incurable wound he was not accepted as a member.

Camillus moved to Rome and began to work at a hospital for incurable patients. He devoted himself to the sick. Eventually Camillus founded an order of priests to care for the sick, nurse victims of the plague, and minister on the battlefields. They wore a large red cross on their habits, and this is where today's Red Cross came from as the universal symbol of charity and service. Camillians wear this cross on their habits to this day. Today there are over 1,000 members of his order serving in 35 countries throughout the world.

St. Camillus died in 1607 and is the patron saint of doctors and those with gambling addictions.

St. Camillus, obtain for us a spirit of compassion for the sick and those with various infirmities. Let us always be eager to care for them, physically or spiritually.
